Hummingbirds communicate by making visual displays and a number of unmusical calls, from deep gutturals to high pitched chirps.

Males may raise their feathers and toss their head from side to side, while uttering shrill sounds. Females are more likely to do perched displays where they spread their tail feathers to show the white tips.

Male & females will perform a shuttle-flight where they move in a rapid back and forth movement in front of another bird. The narrowly focused shuttle dance of the male is usually part of a courtship ritual. After he finds a ready female, he flies in front of her in short, rapid arcs. The dance field may be only ten inches wide.

With some species, the males gather in communities which are called leks. Then they all sing together to try to entice females to come into the neighborhood for mating.
